Minimum Requirements: Tertiary Qualification (Diploma/Degree) in Science/Environmental Science/Chemistry • Minimum 1 year experience in Science/Environmental Science/Chemistry • Must have a valid Code B driver's license.

Other requirements: Good Health and Sober habits • Must be able to work in a team • Available to work overtime if/when needed • Willing to work in all weather conditions • Willing to work on different sites within the WC024 • Good human relation skills • Must be disciplined and organised • Good health and must look presentable • Good attendance record • Communication skills in 2 of the 3 official languages of the Western Cape (English, Afrikaans, Xhosa) • Eligible to be appointed as a Law Enforcement Officer • Water and wastewater sampling experience would be advantageous • Computer literate and sound report writing skills

Responsibilities/ Duties:

- Implement the Trade Effluent (TE) policy/bylaws in the geographical area, ensuring that TE discharges into sewers are controlled as specified in the Water Act 1991 and local bylaws
- Assist in maximising Trade Effluent income through the collection of correct analytical & flow data for charges to be levied on Traders
- Responsible for the delivery of the T E compliance monitoring and sampling programme
- Demonstrate the ability to work without supervision and deal effectively with incidents that occur on Trade premises, the network, rivers or Stellenbosch Municipality assets.
- Recognises when there is a need to escalate to the Technician: Water and Wastewater Treatment Works presenting with the issue, recommendations, and have awareness of the cost implications
- Responsible for maintaining any equipment used in sampling and monitoring of trade discharges in accordance with QMS & regulation requirements.
- To instigate, or assist the Technician, in any investigation concerning unsatisfactory or illegal discharges to sewer. This will involve formal sampling, production of statements, and representing Stellenbosch Municipality in any subsequent legal proceedings.
- Compile monthly Trade Effluent reports, contracts, accounts, notices and penalties and all administrative duties relating to pollution control.
- Responsible for the collection of non-regulatory samples and data from WWTW that are at risk, or non-compliant, in order to assist in any investigation to determine remedial action.
- Required to liaise closely with operational staff and process technicians in the escalation of any near-miss or failed sample to ensure remedial action can be undertaken quickly and effectively with the relevant Technician.
- To investigate and determine the source of illegal discharges to the sewerage system, by a thorough investigation of all known or potential TE in a particular area, thereby preventing the malfunction of the receiving wastewater treatment works
- To ensure accurate and timely information is available for billing traders, as necessary.
